Roks in brief...

- The National Organisation for Women's Shelters and Young Women Shelters in Sweden.
- Roks was founded in 1984 and is the largest organisation for women's and young women's shelters in Sweden.
- There are currently around 100 members within Roks.



... Roks in brief

- Roks purpose is to take care of the common interests of the shelters, in their work against male violence towards women.
- Roks is a feministic organisation, that works for women's and girl's rights and liberation, as well as gender equality on all levels in society.

Support to Members


- Education

Create good connections with other organisations, to exchange experiences and knowledge.





Same, same but different...

- Each shelter within Roks is its own association, with its own rules and routines.
- There are large differences in resources between the shelters.
- All member shelters work on the basis of Roks common values and ethical guidelines.

- We also share basic knowledge, routines and methods.
- Every shelter has their own emergency helpline and can offer various kinds of support to abused women.
- Women can always be anonymous.





What the women's shelters can offer...

- Support for the woman to handle her experiences and help plan for the future
- A safe environment
- To accompany the woman to the police, social services etc



What the women's shelters can offer

- To contact different authorities
- To find a new school for the children of the abused woman
- Information and lectures about male violence against women
- Some shelters are specialised in legal advise



What the young women's shelters can offer

- Support, by phone, e-mail and chat
- Group activities for young women
- Preventative work in schools
- Influencing public opinion

Reports about assaults on women...

- According to the Swedish national council for crime prevention (Brå) 10 115 cases of assault on women (over 18 years old) by a man that was close to the assaulted woman, was reported to the police in 2017.
- Brå estimates that only every fifth case of assault on women is reported.

Laws about Women's peace...

- Public prosecution (1982)
- Victim's legal advisor (1988)
- The restraining orders act (1988)
- Legislation on gross violation of a woman's integrity (1998)
- Legislation on female genital mutilation (1998)



Laws about Women's peace

- The prostitution law (1999)
- Legislation on (domestic) restraining orders (2003)
- New legislation on sexual crimes (changed criteria concerning rape) (2005 and 2013)
- The stalking act (2011)
