VAWG in the UK

1 in 5 women experienced physical and or sexual violence from their partner.

2 women are killed every week by partners or ex-partners (Wales and England).

4 in 5 BME women who approach refuges for help are turned away (Wales and England).

NRPF category: migrant women with no access to public support.

92% women with insecure status seeking support for violence reported threats of deportation by perpetrator (out of 183 women).

40% of women reported staying in relationship for 5+ years.

99% of BME women victims felt safe at BME organisations that supported them with their case.


Undocumented migrants





Mayor of London to Home Office

Mayor and the Victims' Commissioner have jointly called for:

- Operational guidelines on how to respond to victims with insecure immigration status, including prioritising safety and support over immigration offences.
- The reinstatement of **legal aid** for immigration cases to ensure those with insecure status can access independent advice and support
- Victims of violence to be entitled to financial support and safe accommodation in order to leave an abusive relationship, irrespective of their immigrations status
